Who We Serve

Community Service Board of Middle Georgia is a community program that serves all referrals meeting admission criteria. The Crisis Stabilization Unit specializes in services that meet the need of people 18 years or older experiencing a psychiatric crisis or in need of detoxification services. Our program is designed to provide responsive and caring services to people needing crisis intervention during some of their most difficult times.

Confidentiality

Your confidentiality is assured through policies, procedures, and laws that protect your personal health information (Such as HIPPA) With your written permission, information may be shared with your family as part of the treatment plan. Family inclusion during treatment planning is always encouraged.

Behavioral Health Services

Any person requiring mental health crisis intervention or detox may be eligible for admission to the CSU.

Everyone admitted should be 18 years of age or have proof of emancipation.

Treatment consists of daily evaluations by medical staff, 24 hour/day nursing supervision, supervised medication administration and daily education/training groups.

Individualized discharge planning provides linkage to community resources. A follow-up visit with a licensed staff member is made within 7 days of discharge. A physician appointment will be scheduled within 14 days upon discharge. If medications are prescribed, you will be sent home with a 5 day supply and a 30 day prescription.



Crisis Services

The Crisis Stabilization Unit was established in 2005 as a 24-hour structured residential program. This 16-bed locked residential treatment facility provides supervision and support for adults needing psychiatric and detox services. People admitted are served on a short-term basis only, with an average length of stay of 5 days.

The goals of the CSU are to prevent unnecessary hospitalization or re-hospitalization, provide psychiatric and addictive disease stabilization, and mobilize the resources of the community to link the person to the appropriate service and support needed for their ongoing care.

Fees

People who come to our unit are encouraged to bring financial information regarding their income.

Insurance, Medicaid and Medicare are acceptable. No one is denied services because of their inability to pay.




Mission Statement
